• **Disabled American Veterans (DAV)**

These claims can provide the veteran with additional monthly compensation and access to VA healthcare for service related disabilities. Local Veterans Service Offices act as advocates for the veteran community helping them and their families obtain the benefits they are due from federal, state, and local sources. They are a part of the County of San Diego and not the federal government. They provide information and referrals for: public assistance, Veterans Affairs medical care, homeless issues, disability transition counseling, and certification of discharge papers (DD-214) for filing claims with the VA. They can assist with non-service connected pensions and death pensions, military records and corrections, decorations requests, discharge upgrades, vocational rehabilitation, state college tuition fee waivers, Cal-VET loans, VA benefits, veteran and survivor long-term care, disability life insurance and waiver of premiums.
