- Ending Fund Balance \$1,456,065


COC Conclusion

All budgets for the Measure P Spending Plan were prepared in compliance with the ordinance, including the bond proceeds. The COC has reviewed the Independent Auditor's Report on Compliance with Applicable Requirements prepared by the audit firm of Lance, Soll and Lunghard (LSL), the Measure P Spending Plan, and various expenditure and revenue reports prepared by city staff.



Measure P Bond Proceeds

- Issued \$70 million in bond proceeds. Initially estimated that we would be able to borrow \$50 million which provided opportunity to advance projects and avoid higher repair/replacements costs down the road.
- Borrowed at very low interest rate 1.8%
- Ensured funds would be dedicated to infrastructure identified as in critical need of repair/replacement.


Parkway Recreation Center








Fleet Replacement








What is Measure P?

Chula Vista voters approved Measure P – a temporary, ten-year, half-cent sales tax to fund high priority infrastructure needs. Collection of the sales tax began April 1, 2017. The sales tax is projected to raise \$175 million. The <u>infrastructure</u>, <u>Facultina and Equipment</u> <u>Expenditure Plan</u> guides implementation of Measure P sales tax Sonds. <u>Learn Mage</u> >
