Subject: Update - May "Maya" Millete Investigation

Message: **Investigative Update for June 30, 2021 (FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE)**

The Chula Vista Police Department continues to work with the multi-agency working group including the San Diego County District Attorney's Office, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), and the Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS) with the primary goal of finding the reason behind the disappearance of May "Maya" Millete.

Law enforcement officers working this case remain as dedicated as they did on the first day of opening the case with the primary goal of bringing May home to her family or bringing justice to May's family regarding her disappearance. This law enforcement partnership has worked together since April and is in constant communication regarding May's disappearance.

Statement from Chula Vista Police Chief Roxana Kennedy: "I am grateful for the outpouring of community support for May's family during this very difficult time. Our investigators along with the multi-agency working group have been working nonstop behind the scenes on this investigation and remain dedicated to finding May or bringing justice to May's family."

Since 01/11/2021, Detectives from CVPD have continuously investigated May's disappearance. Detectives also continue to share leads and evidence regarding May's disappearance with the multi-agency working group. The investigators have conducted numerous search warrants on physical locations, digital evidence and social media content as well as conducted interviews of witnesses to generate new leads and obtain evidence.

The investigators have also followed up on every tip or lead received since May's disappearance. The investigative steps and efforts to date are below;

- Interviews with 68 individuals to include family members, friends, neighbors and witnesses.

- Written 50 search warrants to include residences, vehicles, cellular and electronic devices, call detail records, financial records, social media and cloud data.
 - Search warrant served at May's home on 01/23/2021.
 - Search warrant served at a Millete relatives' home on 04/01/2021.
 - Search warrant served at May's home on 05/07/2021.
 - Gun violence restraining order (GVRO) served on 05/07/2021 to Larry Millete.
- Reviewed over 99 tips on May's possible location and reason for disappearance. These tips have come from the local community and from around the country. Most recent tips continue to include possible sightings of May in different areas of California.
- Based on investigative leads, law enforcement has also conducted searches in the area of east Chula Vista to include 500 Hunte Parkway.

Investigators continue to review multiple items of evidence and are going over thousands of pages of data in the hopes of finding May.

Investigators from the Chula Vista Police Department also continue to also work with members of May's family and remain in frequent communication providing updates on the status of the investigation. The Chula Vista Police Department would also like to recognize the volunteer search efforts and the support from numerous community members assisting to locate May.

The Chula Vista Police Department continues to be the primary point of contact for media inquiries and will continue to provide updates every two weeks until significant information or a break in the case occurs in the investigation. These updates will include any changes in the investigative numbers listed above.

If there is any significant break in this case, a media advisory will be forwarded through normal communications and a press conference will be scheduled allowing ample time for the media to respond.
