

Why Focus on Organics?



- California throws away more than 6 million tons of food waste every year
- Organics produce
 Methane (pollution) when
 they breakdown and
 decompose in landfills

California Legislative History



- Created California Integrated Waste Management Board
- Required Counties to develop SRREs
- Established Diversion Goals: 25% by 1995 and 50% by 2000



AB 341 Recycling (2011)

- Mandatory Commercial Recycling
- State Recycling Goal: 75% by 2020

AB 1826 Organics (2014)

- Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling
- Municipal jurisdictions must adopt program 2014
- Local compliance started 2018


AB 1594 ADC in Landfills (2014)

- Green waste = Disposal
- No longer counted towards diversion

GHG Reduction (2016)

- Sets organic disposal targets
- Mandatory food waste recycling for residents
- Compliance starts 2022

Why Do We Need To Recycle Organic Food





Organic Waste Collection Service


Residential

- Provide source-separated organics collection service to all residents
 - Green Carts for Commingled Organic/Green Waste

Commercial

- Provide source-separated organics collection service to all residents with mandated bin colors & labels
 - Black Bins for Solid Waste
 - Blue Bins for Recyclables
 - Green Bins or Carts for Commingled Organics or Food Waste-Only

Gleaning in Chula Vista and the south bay community:

- <u>Harvest Crops</u> is based in Lemon Grove. Harvest CROPS organizes teams of volunteers to pick fruit from backyards and orchards throughout San Diego County.
- <u>Senior Gleaners</u> is based in East & South County.
 Volunteers, ages 55 and older, glean surplus food from fields, groves, backyards. Senior Gleaners also collects surplus food from stores and restaurants.

Gleaning groups gather produce that is destined to be wasted, from trees, fields, and farmers markets. The produce is then donated to local food pantries.

Benefits of Composting





Reduce Greenhouse Gases

Less organic waste in landfills means fewer greenhouse gases emitted into the air.



Organics Converted to Compost

Organic waste can be converted into compost—a nutrient-rich soil amendment.



Minimize Landfill Waste


Organic waste recycling diverts food waste from landfills and beneficially reuses it.



Sustainable Community

Composting can reduce the household waste that goes to a landfill and benefit the environment.

Breaking
Down the
Composting
Process



Collection

Yard and food waste are collected from residents, restaurants, and other businesses.





Transportation

- Regular route trucks transport loads of organic waste for recycling.
- Weekly pick-ups



Composting

- Organic waste is recycled through the composting process, which turns the yard and food waste into a nutrient-rich soil amendment that improves the soil.
- Otay Landfill Composting Facility



Circular Economy

• Compost is marketed and sold to landscapers, golf courses, farmers, and residential customers.



Organic Waste Solutions

Republic Services processed 1.7 billion pounds of yard and food waste at our organics facilities last year, creating more than 275,000 tons of compost.


