



2020 Redistricting Commission

Redistricting Plan Creation Process

A. Receiving Public Input

1. Public speakers shall each be allotted five minutes to speak.
2. At the discretion of the Chair, or a majority vote of the Commission, the public comment period may be reopened during any meeting to solicit further feedback on any issue related to the redistricting plans.
3. Public speakers shall each be allotted three minutes to speak during a reopened public comment period.
4. Commissioners will not interrupt public speakers. The Chair may ask a public speaker to focus their testimony on the matter at hand, or as the time limit approaches, to wrap up their comments.
5. The Chair and Commissioners will refrain from commenting on public input received other than to thank individuals for their comments. The Chair and Commissioners speaking through the Chair can ask a speaker to clarify any comments when necessary.
6. The Chair and Commissioners will consider all written and electronic comments submitted.
7. Time limits may be adjusted for all speakers at the discretion of the Chair, with approval of the Commission, as circumstances may dictate.

B. Number of Plans to Be Created

1. The Commission will publish no more than one final Draft Redistricting Plan(s) for public review.
2. The Commission will produce no more than one Recommended Redistricting Plan for City Council consideration.

C. Ad Hoc Subcommittee

1. The Commission will create an Ad Hoc Subcommittee to draft and finalize the Commission's Recommended Districting Plan report to City Council.
2. The Ad Hoc Committee will include the Chair and be comprised of no more than three Commission members.
3. The Ad Hoc Committee will work with staff, NDC, and SWS as appropriate to finalize and submit the report in time for the December 7, 2021 City Council meeting.
