


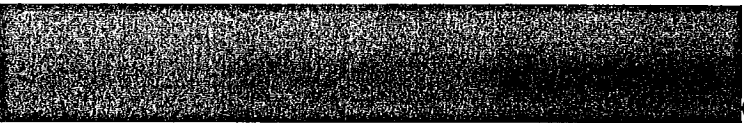


On 09-19-17, at approximately 2238 hours, I responded to a call of an officer that had just been stabbed at  Monterey Ave. in the city of Chula Vista. I arrived on scene at approximately 2234 hours and made contact with CVPD Officer Carmona ID #1165. Officer Carmona was North of  Monterey Ave. tending to CVPD Officer Sachs ID#1184 injuries 



 Officer Sachs told me he was fine so, I continued to ask other officers where they needed my assistance. I made contact with CVPD Agent Meredith ID #646 in the front yard of  Monterey Ave. He advised me to go tell the fire department they were clear to enter the house. I contacted fire and advised them they were clear.

At approximately 2300 hours, I cleared the scene and returned to service.

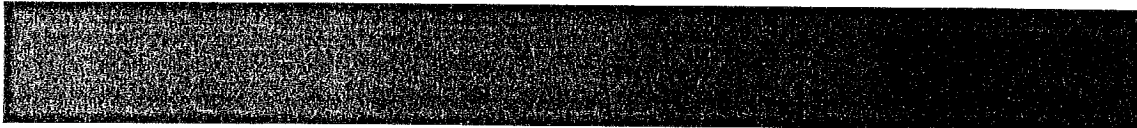

This is a supplemental report to Chula Vista Police Case # 17-13455

On September 19, 2017 at approximately 2221 hours, I was covering Southwestern College Police Officer Sylvester W. ID# 3629 on a lewd conduct call at [redacted] Buena Vista Way [redacted]. During the investigation, Officer Sylvester told me that he heard, over the police radio, a Chula Vista Police Department (CVPD) dispatcher requesting officers to respond to [redacted] Monterey Ave to assist an officer that had been stabbed.

At approximately 2231 hours, I followed Officer Sylvester to [redacted] Monterey Ave. At approximately 2234 hours, I arrived at the scene and started assisting the officers. As I was walking Westbound on Monterey Ave, I noticed CVPD Officer Carmona, M, ID1165, was attending to CVPD Officer D.



As I continued walking towards the subject's house, CVPD Agent Meredith, M, ID648, was asking officers to bring paramedics into the house to assist the subject that had been shot. I proceeded to get the attention of the paramedics and walked with them towards Agent Meredith who was standing outside the house. Agent Meredith then walked inside the house with the paramedics.

As I started walking towards my patrol vehicle, I noticed CVPD Officer Murofushi, G, ID1122 was talking to a white female adult who was crying and sitting on the sidewalk. At approximately 2301 hours, I cleared the scene and returned to Southwestern College.

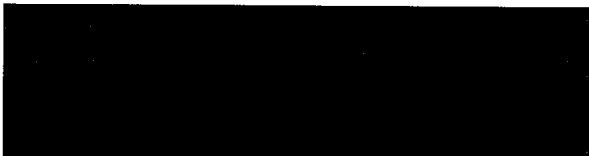

I am a Police Agent currently employed by the Chula Vista Police Department and have been so employed for 18 years. I am currently assigned to the Criminal Investigation Division with the Digital Evidence Unit. I have been certified as a Cellebrite Logical Operator, a Cellebrite Physical Analyst, MSAB XRY Certified Operator and MSAB XRY Intermediate Operator/Examiner. I have over 40 hours of training in the forensic extraction and examination of mobile devices. I have over 200 hours of computer forensic training. I have forensically extracted and analyzed over 200 mobile devices, Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) Cards, and/or SanDisk (SD) Cards.

DETAILS:

On 09/22/17, Det. Sharpe #809 brought an LG-K373 Eclipse 3 to the Chula Vista Police Department/ Digital Evidence Unit (CVPD/DEU) asking for assistance in retrieving data from this device regarding an Officer Involved Shooting (OIS). Det. Sharpe stated the phone belonged to a suspect named David Scott. Det. Sharpe subsequently prepared search warrant [REDACTED] which was signed on 09/22/17 allowing CVPD/DEU to collect data from this phone.

CSO Barajas initially received the phone and was unsuccessful in extracting any data. On 09/26/17 I attempted to extract data from the phone. I saw that CSO Barajas had already prepared the phone for extraction by enabling the developer options.

There was no external digital media (i.e SD card).

EXTRACTIONS:

I saw that the specific phone profile was not available from Cellebrite to extract data from the phone. I was able to search the internet and discovered that the LG GSM H443 Escape 2 was

a sister profile of this phone. I used this profile and was successful in extracting data from the Eclipse 3.

Logical and file system extractions were completed using Cellebrite [REDACTED] cellular telephone data extraction software, which I'm trained t / software device is designed specifically for the data extraction of cellular phone digital evidence. Depending on the make and model of phone the Cellebrite [REDACTED] extracts data such as contacts, text messages (SMS & MMS), pictures, videos, call logs, internet searches, ESN, IMEI information, etc. The extracted data can be verified using industry standard [REDACTED] algorithms.

After the extraction, I disabled the developer options and turned off the phone.

Data from both extractions were saved to the Government owned Talino forensic computer upon which the UFED 4PC resides. The data was parsed using Cellebrite Physical Analyzer [REDACTED]

EXAMINATION:

I exported the Cellebrite UFED Physical Analyzer evidence reports generated during these extractions to an external 256GB flash drive. The evidence reports were transferred to a network accessible to Det. Sharpe. A digital evidence copy of the Cellebrite extractions will be maintained by on a 4.7GB DVD -R disc. The phone and disk were returned to Det. Sharpe on 09/26/17.

No forensic examination of the data by DEU was requested by Det. Sharpe.

CRIME SCENE

Chula Vista Police Department

NOTIFICATION:

I am a detective assigned to the Chula Vista Police Department (CVPD), Criminal Investigations Division (CID), Crimes of Violence Homicide Unit (COV). I have worked in this specific unit for approximately 4 years.

On 9-19-17 (Tuesday) at approximately 2240 hours, I was contacted by my supervisor in the Crimes of Violence Unit, Sergeant D. Oyos #752. At the time, I was off-duty. Sergeant Oyos advised a CVPD officer had been stabbed in conjunction with an Officer Involved Shooting (OIS). He directed me to respond to the station to meet with other responding investigators and then to meet at the command post located in the [REDACTED] J Street in Chula Vista.

I responded to the station (CVPD) and arrived at approximately 2339 hours. I met with COV Detectives S. Sharpe #809 and J. Monreal #905. We gathered our equipment and responded to the command post located in the parking lot of Chula Vista Community Church, [REDACTED] J Street in Chula Vista. I arrived in the lot at approximately 2357 hours. COV Detective P. Alvarez joined us at the command post shortly after we arrived. Detective Sharpe was assigned as the case agent and I was assigned scene agent.

SCENE BRIEF:

There were several officers and supervisors at the command post when I arrived. On-scene supervisors from the Criminal Investigations Division (CID) included Capt. V. Sallee #566, Lt. K. Heinz #628 (Acting Investigations Lieutenant), and Sgt. D. Oyos. From the Professional Standards Unit (PSU) Lt. D. Redmond #586 and Sgt. R. Rea #640 were on scene. In addition to the officers/supervisors who later took part in the brief, I noticed [REDACTED] near the command post. We waited at the command post for a significant time prior to commencing the brief. This was largely due to awaiting the arrival of assisting investigators and a representative from the San Diego County District Attorney's Office.

Regarding assisting investigators, we activated three members of the Homicide Relief Team. This included Detectives A. Gonzalez #804, L. Ruiz #1057, and J. Vasquez #975. They and District Attorney Investigator (DAI) R. Lobato arrived at the command post prior to the briefing.

Sgt. Oyos initiated the scene briefing at approximately, 0110 hours (Wednesday/9-20-17). The briefing was recorded (audio) and later submitted into evidence. The following are summaries of statements made by officers during the briefing. For details, refer to the recording.

SGT. S. ADKINS #612 (STREET TEAM SUPERVISOR):

At approximately 2059 hours, CVPD Dispatch received a call from [REDACTED] the resident at [REDACTED] Melrose Avenue in Chula Vista (Incident #170919L00092074). [REDACTED] reported a disturbance between he and his neighbor at [REDACTED] Monterey Avenue. The disturbance involved the suspected neighbor yelling and throwing something at the reporting party, [REDACTED]. At the time of the incident, it was 69 degrees, conditions were clear and dark, with standard street lighting.

The call was dispatched at 2157 hours. Officers arrived at [REDACTED] Melrose Avenue at approximately 2208 hours. Officers arrived at [REDACTED] Monterey Avenue at approximately 2225 hours. Officers alerted dispatch to "shots fired" and "officer stabbed" at 2228 hours. The involved officers were Officers DAVID SACHS #1184 (311J) and LEO BANALES #534 (315X).

The scene was located at [REDACTED] Monterey Avenue and at the time was being held secure by Officer Zimmer #1083. The scene also included the driveway area of the home secured by Officer C. Park #1124. Officer SACHS's duty gun belt and firearm were in a bag on top of a patrol car, secured by Officer M. Carmona #1165 (At the time of the briefing, Sgt. Adkins believed the gun belt had been removed by the ambulance staff).

[REDACTED] The injuries were no longer considered to be life threatening. Officer BANALES rode with Officer SACHS to [REDACTED] in the ambulance.

The suspect (DAVID SCOTT) was located on the living room floor of [REDACTED] Monterey Avenue. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] **DAVID SCOTT** was pronounced deceased at approximately 2329 hours at [REDACTED]

The priority witnesses were Officer L. BANALES and [REDACTED] (here after Chula Vis [REDACTED] was DAVID SCOTT's mother and she was inside the home when the initial officers responded. The suspect was identified as DAVID JOSEPH SCOTT with a date of birth of [REDACTED]-89. He was a White male adult, listed as 5'11" and approximately 200 pounds (He weighed in much heavier during autopsy processing).

Responding medical aid staff were Chula Vista Fire Department (CVFD) Engines [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], as well as AMR (American Medical Response) unit numbers [REDACTED] and 4 [REDACTED] AMR [REDACTED] transported Officer SACHS to [REDACTED]. AMR [REDACTED] transported DAVID SCOTT to [REDACTED] DAVID SCOTT was accompanied by Officer R. Yates during his transport.

OFFICER L. BANALES (PATROL TEAM #4):

"We" got a call from the resident on Melrose [REDACTED]. When Officers BANALES and SACHS spoke with [REDACTED] he took them to his backyard and showed them a concrete chunk that the suspect (DAVID SCOTT) threw at him. [REDACTED] pointed out the [REDACTED] house to the rear of his yard as being the suspect's home. Officers told [REDACTED] they would go to the blue house and speak with whomever the suspect was and then return to speak with [REDACTED]

Officer BANALES and SACHS then responded to the house on Monterey [REDACTED] (Monterey Avenue, Chula Vista). When the suspect's mother [REDACTED] answered the door, Officer SACHS was to the left of the door and Officer BANALES was to the right. [REDACTED] Officer BANALES's "ride-a-long", was standing behind the officers. [REDACTED] Officer BANALES couldn't recall the exact words she used at the time of the briefing, but stated his body worn camera (BWC) was activated during the contact.

[REDACTED] They told her "Yes." Officer SACHS entered the home first, followed by Officer BANALES and [REDACTED]. As soon as they entered the home they were in a little foyer area. It was "very small" and crowded for all three of them. DAVID SCOTT came from the kitchen area and "ambushed" Officer SACHS, striking him. Officer BANALES thought Officer SACHS was just getting "striked" but later realized Officer SACHS was actually getting stabbed by DAVID SCOTT.

Officer SACHS knocked DAVID SCOTT down to the ground. When Officer BANALES was moving in to assist, Officer SACHS yelled out DAVID SCOTT had a knife. Officer BANALES then noticed DAVID SCOTT had a small steak knife type weapon in one of his hands. Officer BANALES backed away and then heard several

shots. He estimated he heard, but did not see 4 or 5 shots. Upon hearing that, Officer BANALES broadcasted that information on his radio.

At that time, Officer BANALES expected to see DAVID SCOTT following out of the house after him. Officer BANALES, however, realized DAVID SCOTT was not coming out. Instead he saw Officer SACHS exiting the home. He described Officer SACHS as being calm.

Officer BANALES worked on broadcasting suspect information and obtaining a tourniquet for Officer SACHS.

Officer BANALES said they were still concerned DAVID SCOTT might come out of the home after them. For that reason, they backed away to the edge of the driveway and waited for responding officers. While standing by for additional officers, Officer BANALES began providing first aid to Officer SACHS. In the process, he removed Officer SACHS's gun belt and placed it on top of a patrol car. Upon Officer SACHS being transported to the hospital, Officer BANALES joined him in the ambulance.

Upon conclusion of the open-ended portion of his brief, Officer BANALES answered investigators' questions. He clarified he and [REDACTED] both provided first aid to Officer SACHS. He said the mentioned concrete chunk was in [REDACTED] backyard when it was shown to officers. He described it as being a little bigger than a softball. Officer BANALES added that [REDACTED] howed him [REDACTED] where he was struck by the chunk.

Officer BANALES clarified [REDACTED] was struck by the concrete chunk and that [REDACTED] believed it was a male from the pointed-out home [REDACTED] Monterey Avenue) that threw it at him. [REDACTED] was not able to identify a suspect because he only saw the top portion of the suspect's face. [REDACTED] did not make any statements of previous interaction with the suspect at [REDACTED] Monterey Avenue and Officer BANALES didn't recall asking him specifically about that.

Officer BANALES was asked to explain [REDACTED] actions during the incident. He recalled Officer SACHS asked [REDACTED] if her son had any violent tendencies. It was at that point that DAVID SCOTT "rushed" them. He also explained how the kitchen was set to the right of the foyer as they entered the home.

SGT. D. KENDRICKS #904 (PATROL TEAM #2 SUPERVISOR):

Sgt. Kendrick arrived on scene shortly after A/Sgt. Meredith led assisting officers into the home to clear the residence [REDACTED] Monterey Avenue). Sgt. Kendrick saw Officer SACHS, Officer BANALES, and [REDACTED] standing next to a vehicle.

[REDACTED] Officer SACHS was "combat breathing" and told Sgt. Kendricks he was doing okay.

Sgt. Kendricks asked Officer SACHS for a safety statement. Officer SACHS told him he believed he shot about 4 or 5 times inside the house. The suspect was hit and was on the ground inside of the house.

While Sgt. Kendricks stood on scene, Officer N. Hicks #1132 approached him carrying Officer SACHS's firearm. Officer Hicks told him it had already been unloaded and cleared. Sgt. Kendricks instructed Officer Hicks to place the firearm in a bag and put it on top of the same vehicle where Officer SACHS's clothing had been placed. He assigned Officer Carmona to watch the items and treat them as evidence. Sgt. Kendricks later learned the clothing had been removed by Officer BANALES and [REDACTED]

While waiting for medics, Sgt. Kendricks entered the home to check the status of DAVID SCOTT. DAVID SCOTT was inside the residence on the kitchen/dining room floor. When Sgt. Kendricks approached the house, he saw Officer SACHS's exterior vest in the driveway with the BWC still activated. There was blood all over the vest. Sgt. Kendricks directed Officer Parks to maintain a watch over the vest.

When Sgt. Kendricks entered the home, he saw a kitchen knife with about a 4" blade on the floor. It didn't have any blood on it but it appeared to have somehow been involved in the incident. He told the officers not to disturb any of the evidence if possible. Sgt. Kendricks spoke with A/Sgt. Meredith inside the home. A/Sgt. Meredith informed him DAVID SCOTT had been shot and was on the ground. He advised Sgt. Kendricks that Officers T. McAtee #1101 and T. Wall #1065 were providing first aid to DAVID SCOTT. Sgt. Kendricks could hear DAVID SCOTT making noises and speaking with officers. Sgt. Kendricks walked back outside and informed firefighters the suspect needed medical attention.

Sgt. Kendricks noted other observations. He said DAVID SCOTT's clothing was inside on the floor. He also saw casings on the floor inside the residence and large pools of blood. He saw blood splatter on the walls, including that of the entryway. He saw blood on the driveway as well.

Once DAVID SCOTT was loaded into the ambulance, Sgt. Kendricks directed Officer Yates to ride in the ambulance with DAVID SCOTT. Sgt. Kendricks directed Officer BANALES to ride with Officer SACHS and [REDACTED] in the separate ambulance.

At the time of the briefing, Officer G. Murofushi #1122 was standing by with [REDACTED] Officer Hicks had relieved Officer Carmona so Officer Carmona could respond to the command post. Sgt. Kendrick asked Officer Hicks how he came upon Officer SACHS's firearm. Officer Hicks told him it had been given to him. Sgt. Kendrick spoke with [REDACTED] who explained after the stabbing, Officer SACHS had a hard time putting the firearm back into the holster due to his state of mind. Therefore, [REDACTED] took the firearm from him and put it on an "overhang." He told Officer Hicks where the gun was so Officer Hicks could take possession of it.

Upon conclusion of the open-ended portion of his brief, Sgt. Kendrick answered investigators' questions. Sgt. Kendrick stated Officer J. Garcia #1207 was maintaining the crime scene log and Officer Hicks had taken over for Officer Carmona who was maintaining the scribe position for the inner perimeter. Sgt. Kendrick explained the inner perimeter was where Officer SACHS had been standing when Sgt. Kendrick arrived on scene. Sgt. Kendrick also confirmed his BWC was activated when he responded.

Sgt. Kendrick reiterated it was Officers McAtee and Wall providing first aid to DAVID SCOTT and speaking with him. Sgt. Kendrick said DAVID SCOTT seemed somewhat alert when officers spoke to him but he was not really saying much. He was more moaning than speaking. DAVID SCOTT was on his back. He knew he had been shot and was making incoherent statements. Agent R. Murgia #787 took initial scene photographs with a department camera while DAVID SCOTT was still on scene. Sgt. Kendrick had no knowledge of any other photographs taken related to the incident.

OFFICER C. VALDIVIA JR. #1096 (PATROL OFFICER TEAM #3):

Upon Officer Valdivia's arrival to the scene, he heard an officer shout towards the house [REDACTED] Monterey Avenue), telling the suspect to stay down and not to move. At that time a white female adult [REDACTED] exited the home, screaming. Officer Valdivia walked her away from the house and had her take a seat. He tried to speak with her but she initially was unable to speak. When she calmed down she spoke with Officers Valdivia and Murofushi. Officer Valdivia explained he did not have a BWC due to the exigency of the response. When he heard the call, he jumped into Officer McAtee's patrol vehicle so he could get to the scene to assist. Officer Murofushi, however, did have a BWC and had it activated while they spoke with [REDACTED]

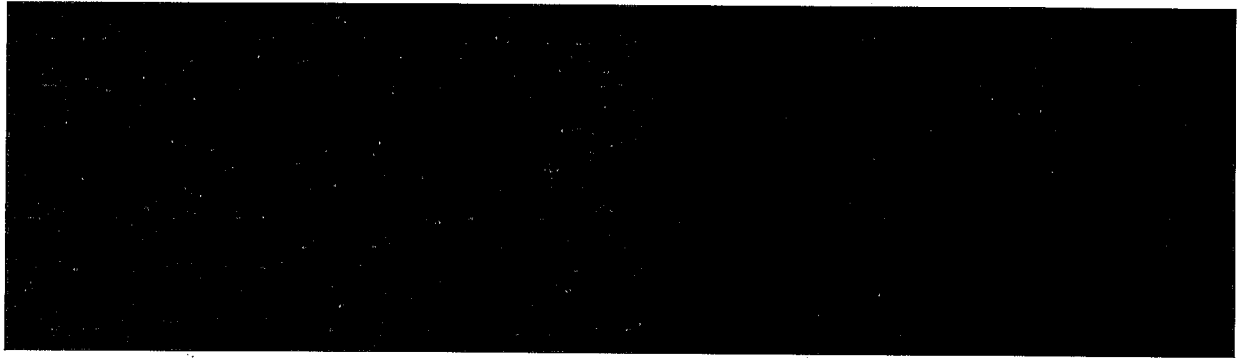

CRIME SCENE:

After the scene briefing, I met with Sgt. Oyos and our COV team to discuss assignments. We then determined who would be walking into the crime scene for an initial walk-through led by Officer BANALES. Those assigned to take part in the walk-through donned paper suit booties and checked in with the bearer of the scene log. See the log for details.

At approximately 0210 hours (9-20-17) we began the walk-through. The inner perimeter of the scene was the lot, including the house, yard, and driveway at [REDACTED] Monterey Avenue. It was cordoned off with yellow police tape out to the curb. The outer perimeter, cordoned off with yellow police tape, included much of Monterey street in front of the home from [REDACTED] including blocking off access from [REDACTED] James Street.

I walked onto the driveway of [REDACTED] Monterey Avenue, into the inner perimeter with Officer BANALES. I observed the home was a single story, single family home. [REDACTED]

At the entry point where I walked onto the driveway, I saw Officer SACHS's outer uniform vest resting on the driveway next to a pool of blood. The outer vest bore a CVPD badge, police insignia, a police radio, and an attached body-worn-camera (BWC). The front of the vest was covered with blood. Officer Park was maintaining watch over it.

There were drops of blood on the concrete leading to the front door and in the area just outside the entrance. I approached the main entrance and took note of the double doors. The right door of the set was closed and the left door open. Officer Zimmer was posted just inside the doorway. As I walked into the home, I saw blood on the walls just inside the entryway, including on the open door. I took note of the small room I was standing in once I crossed the threshold. It was the foyer Officer BANALES had mentioned during the briefing. It would have been a tight fit for more than a couple adults. The foyer contained an open closet that did not have doors. It had a curtain but the curtain had been pulled back prior to the walk-through.

The foyer split in two directions. If I was to go left, I'd enter what appeared to be a family room or living room. It had old furniture and file cabinets and seemed to be used as an office. Going right, I entered the kitchen. I saw a steak knife on the floor next to the refrigerator and only a few feet from the foyer. It had about a 3 1/2" blade and a black handle. It was hard to tell, given the lighting and position of the knife, if it had any blood on it. It seemed consistent, however, with the knife described by officers as being the weapon used to attack and stab Officer SACHS. There was blood on the linoleum kitchen floor.

The blood continued into the living room, which was left of the kitchen as entered from the foyer. The living room and kitchen were separated by a counter containing numerous household items and dishes. There were pools of blood covering the floor in different areas of the living room. I observed four spent shell casings on the floor of the living room near the west wall by a piano. The casings were spread out almost evenly. I saw remnants of life saving efforts including purple protective gloves and cut up bloody clothing in the open area of the living room floor between the kitchen counter and the piano.

I looked outside the open sliding door that led to the backyard. The door was at the south wall of the living room. I saw the wooden fence that enclosed the backyard. I stepped out and walked west into the yard. I saw a folding chair set up along the fence where the property backed up against [REDACTED] yard. This was at the far northwest corner of DAVID SCOTT's yard. The yard was primarily dirt. In the dirt yard, I saw broken pieces of what looked like stone or concrete, possibly from yard decorations. Given the location of the folding chair, it seemed likely the person who threw the rock at [REDACTED] had used the chair to gain access over the fence line.

After a walk-through of the residence, I exited the home and took note of the vehicle parked in the driveway near the front door, outside of the garage. It was a gold, 4-Door, Honda Civic, bearing California license plate number [REDACTED]. It was registered to [REDACTED]. I later learned this was DAVID SCOTT's sister. The windows were up but I could see easily into the vehicle since the windows were not tinted. I saw letters in the backseat area addressed to [REDACTED]. On the back floorboard I saw a small white paper bag with a "RITE AID" logo on it. It seemed consistent with [REDACTED]. I was unable to see what the bag contained. I recalled that during the briefing, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] I finished the walk-through at approximately 0228 hours.

While still on scene, I had FS VENN take exterior photographs of the crime scene, including the area covering street, within the exterior perimeter and the vehicles within it. I also had her photograph Officer SACHS's exterior vest. Upon her taking the photographs of the vest, I had

The phone had the back taken off and the battery was out. It did not have a case. It was in good condition. I turned on the phone, it was not locked and I placed it into airplane mode.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION:

Using Cellebrite UFED Physical Analyzer [REDACTED] cellular telephone data extraction device, which I'm trained to use, I began the extraction process. This software device is designed specifically for the data extraction of cellular phone digital evidence. Depending on the make and model of phone the Cellebrite [REDACTED] extracts data such as contacts, text messages (SMS & MMS), pictures, videos, call logs, internet searches, ESN, IMEI information, etc. The extracted data is verified using industry standard MD5 and SHA1 hash algorithms.

LOGICAL EXAMINATION:

I exported the Cellebrite UFED Physical Analyzer evidence reports generated during these extractions to an external 256GB flash drive and uploaded them to the PhoneExtracts drive where the detectives could analyze the data.

I was not asked to conduct an examination of the extracted data.

I replaced the phone back into the bag and locked it in the exam room for my partner to attempt a physical or file system extraction on it.
