**ANNUAL ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION** 

California Health and Safety Code 25915.2 requires that an annual written notice of the presence of asbestoscontaining building materials be provided to all employees. The purpose of this notification is to ensure that all persons working in or using these facilities are fully informed of the areas where asbestos-containing materials are known to be present. In addition to distribution of the notification to all employees, copies shall be posted in a conspicuous place in affected areas.

Prior to 1979 asbestos was used extensively by the building industry throughout the United States as thermal insulation, fireproofing and in structural support materials. In some City owned facilities asbestos has been used to insulate hot water and steam pipes and ventilation ducts. It may be found in some attics and mechanical rooms as well as in floor and ceiling tiles.

The mere presence of asbestos in a building does not necessarily mean a health hazard exists. Asbestoscontaining building materials are not a health threat unless asbestos fibers become airborne and are inhaled. In areas where the asbestos is bonded or encapsulated, such as in floor tiles or painted and properly maintained insulation material, there is little or no risk to health. It is important not to disturb asbestos-containing materials. Work on asbestos-containing materials is restricted to properly trained and equipped personnel. Moving, drilling, cutting or otherwise disturbing such materials can pose a health risk and should not be attempted by untrained personnel.

The Human Resources Department maintains records of asbestos sampling and air monitoring results performed during asbestos abatement work.
