ACCOMMODATION PROCEDURES FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

THIS IS NOT A COMPREHENSIVE EXPLANATION OF YOUR RIGHTS UNDER THE FEDERAL FAIRHOUSING AMENDMENTS ACT.

You may request a reasonable accommodation to rules, policies, practices and procedures for the siting, development and use of housing, including housing related services or facilities, if you meet all of the following:

- You have a disability* or the housing is for people with disabilities;
- You may need a reasonable accommodation to existing rules and regulations to have equal opportunity to housing and;
- Your request for accommodation would not be an undue burden on the city or county.

If you believe that you satisfy the above criteria and are entitled to a reasonable accommodation under the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988, you may obtain a Fair Housing Accommodation Request form from the front desk or the City's website. To request a form or further access services, please contact the Development Services Department at 619-691-5101 or Telecommunications Devices for the Deaf (TDD) at (619) 585-5647. California Relay Service is also available for the hearing impaired. If you need assistance in applying for a reasonable accommodation, the Department will assist you.

*The Fair Housing Act defines "disability" as any of the following: a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities; a record of having such an impairment or; regarded as having such an impairment. The Fair Housing Act does not protect individuals currently using illegal substances, unless they have a separate disability. 42 U.S.C.§ 3602(h); 24 CFR § 100.201(b)(c) & (d).
